CEB Solar PV Scheme for Domestic Customers (Households) – Revision of the Maximum Allowed Capacity for PV Installations

In line with measures announced in the 2024-2025 Budget, the **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** is pleased to inform the public that the maximum allowed capacity for PV installations under the “**CEB Solar PV Scheme for Domestic Customers (Households)**” has been increased from 5 kW to 15 kW.

The new procedures are as follows:

1. For PV system applications up to 10 kW:

The application procedure remains unchanged. Applicants can proceed with the installation of their PV system once the Application Form and Connection Agreement have been submitted, along with the Processing Fee.

The CEB will notify the applicant of any necessary interventions at the grid-interconnection stage.

2. For PV system applications above 10 kW and up to 15 kW:

Upon receiving an application, the CEB will conduct a Network Survey to determine any required network modifications and associated works. Subsequently, the CEB will issue a ‘Letter of Intent’ to the applicant, outlining the cost of any chargeable works.

The applicant will be allowed to proceed with the installation of the PV system only after settlement of the charges, as applicable.

Customers who have already installed a PV system under the above SSDG Scheme may also apply to upgrade the capacity of their existing PV system.
