ALLOWED CAPACITIES OF SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEMS UNDER THE CEB SOLAR PV SCHEME FOR DOMESTIC CUSTOMERS (HOUSEHOLDS)

The **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** wishes to inform its customers in the Domestic Category and the general public that the principle of determining the allowed capacity (size) of solar photovoltaic (PV) systems under the above-mentioned Scheme has been amended.

Henceforth, an eligible customer in the Domestic Category will be allowed to:

1. Install a solar PV system of capacity not exceeding 3.5 kilowatt-peak (kWp) DC, irrespective of the level of his/her electricity consumption, under a single-phase electricity supply; or
2. Install a solar PV system of capacity above 3.5 kilowatt-peak (kWp) but not exceeding 5.0 kilowatt-peak (kWp) DC, irrespective of the level of his/her electricity consumption, under a three-phase electricity supply.

These amendments will enable faster processing of applications and expedite the implementation of the Scheme. All other terms and conditions of the Scheme remain unchanged.
