LAUNCHING OF CEB SOLAR PV SCHEME FOR DOMESTIC CUSTOMERS (HOUSEHOLDS)

In line with the measures announced in the National Budget Speech 2021-2022, the **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** is pleased to inform its customers and the general public of the launching of the “**CEB Solar PV Scheme for Domestic Customers (Households)**”.

Under this Scheme, the CEB intends to connect a total of ten (10) megawatts (MW) of solar photovoltaic (PV) installations.

The CEB will advise eligible customers on the allowed capacity of each individual solar PV installation based on the electrical configuration, the declared (connected) electrical load of the premises, and the annual electricity requirements. The allowed capacity of the individual solar PV installation can be up to a maximum of five (5) kilowatts-peak (kWp) DC. A three-phase electrical configuration may be required at the customer's premises.

Part of the investment cost for the purchase of the solar PV system can be financed by a “green” loan from commercial banks or a concessional loan from the Development Bank of Mauritius. Eligible customers can also benefit from an income tax deduction under the Solar Energy Investment Allowance.

Customers interested in this Scheme are invited to take cognisance of the terms and conditions, and to download, fill in and submit the corresponding application form. These are available on CEB's website at <https://ceb.mu>

The application form, duly filled in and accompanied by all the required documents, should be submitted to a CEB Customer Service Centre **as from 01 December 2021**. Applications received that are in excess of the 10 MW capacity allocated to the Scheme will be placed on a waiting list.
