LAUNCHING OF CEB SCHEME FOR CORPORATE ENTITIES' ELECTRIC VEHICLES CHARGING

In line with the National Budget Speech 2021-2022, the **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** is pleased to inform its customers and the general public of the launching of the **CEB SCHEME FOR CORPORATE ENTITIES' ELECTRIC VEHICLES CHARGING**.

In the current phase of the Scheme, the CEB will consider applications from Corporate Entities holding active electricity contract accounts, including SMEs, for the proposed use of electricity solely for charging four-wheel electric vehicles (EVs).

The CEB intends to connect a maximum of ten (10) megawatts (MW) of solar photovoltaic (PV) installations under this Scheme. A Corporate Entity will be allowed to install an on-site or off-site solar PV system not exceeding ten (10) kilowatts-peak (kWp) DC for each electric vehicle. A three-phase electrical configuration may be required on the Corporate Entity's premises to allow interconnection of the solar PV system to the CEB grid.

All Corporate Entities interested in the Scheme, having already installed or intending to install EV chargers to power their electric vehicles, are invited to take cognisance of the applicable terms and conditions and to fill in the relevant application form. These are available on CEB's website at <https://ceb.mu> - together with the standard Connection Agreement.

The application form, duly filled in and accompanied by all the required documents and the Connection Agreement, should be submitted to any CEB Customer Service Centre as from 11 April 2022. Applications received that are in excess of the earmarked 10 MW capacity allocated under the Scheme will be placed on a waiting list.
