## LAUNCHING OF THE CEB SCHEME FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS OFFERING PUBLIC CHARGING OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES (EVs) SERVICE

As per the Communiqué of 15 April 2022, the **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** is pleased to inform service providers and the general public of the **CEB Scheme for Service Providers Offering Public Charging of Electric Vehicles (EVs) Service**, which is still open.

Only applications from service providers holding active electricity contract accounts opened for the sole purpose of using electricity to provide public charging of electric vehicles (EVs) service will be considered.

Under this Scheme, among other incentives, a service provider will be allowed to install an on-site or off-site solar PV system to generate the annual electricity requirements of the fleet of EVs it plans to service. In the initial phase of the Scheme, the CEB intends to connect a maximum of ten (10) megawatts (MW) of solar photovoltaic (PV) installations. The installed capacity of the service provider's solar PV system should not exceed two (2.0) megawatts-peak (MWp) DC.

Service providers interested in the Scheme are invited to take cognisance of the applicable terms and conditions and to submit the relevant application form together with the standard Connection Agreement. These are available on CEB's website at https://ceb.mu

The application form, duly filled in and accompanied with all the required documents and the standard Connection Agreement, should be submitted to any CEB Customer Service Centre. Applications received that are in excess of the earmarked 10 MW capacity allocated under the Scheme will be placed on a waiting list.
