LAUNCHING OF CEB SOLAR PV SCHEME FOR CHARGING OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES

As per the Communiqué of 05 November 2021, the **Central Electricity Board (CEB)** is pleased to inform its customers and the general public of the “**CEB Solar PV Scheme for Charging of Electric Vehicles**”, which is still open.

In the current phase of this Scheme, the CEB will consider applications from Domestic, Commercial and Industrial customers who are supplied with electricity via the low-voltage network. Other customers may also apply through CEB’s existing Renewable Energy (RE) Schemes (such as the MSDG RE Scheme, the Public Sector Entities RE Scheme and the Smart City Scheme).

The CEB intends to connect a total of ten (10) megawatts (MW) of solar PV installations under the “CEB Solar PV Scheme for Charging of Electric Vehicles”.

The CEB will advise the customer on the allowed capacity of each individual solar PV installation depending on the electrical configuration, the declared (connected) electrical load of the premises, the capacity of the electric vehicle charger, and the daily electricity requirements for charging the electric vehicle. In no case shall the maximum allowed capacity be higher than 10 kilowatts-peak (kWp) DC. A three-phase electrical configuration may be required on the premises.

Applications received that are in excess of the 10 MW capacity allocated to the Scheme will be placed on a waiting list.

Interested customers who have already installed or intend to install electric chargers to power their electric vehicles are invited to take cognisance of the terms and conditions of the Scheme, and download the corresponding application form.
